






November, 2024 - Library Visits





Ossipee Public Library finished their catalogue migration to the Northern New Hampshire Library Cooperative system. Conway library card holders can now view and borrow items from the Ossipee, Jackson, Madison, and Cook Memorial (Tamworth) Libraries.

The Library has begun working with Northledge Technologies Inc. to update some of our existing tech equipment. We will soon have a new server, public catalogue station, and staff workstations at the Circulation Desk.

Juli Medeiros is wrapping up her GSLIS internship with us through the University of Rhode Island. During her time with us, Juli completed a number of different projects involving collection development and cataloguing, as well as working with Bob in the Henney History Room. One of these projects was to research and create webpages that provide visitors with additional information about the artwork and historical features of the building. Juli learned how to create and 3D print QR codes that can be hung near each piece of artwork for patrons to scan and learn more.

Drea, Tessa, and Jeff have been meeting with the Mount Washington Observatory to discuss potential partnerships between our organizations, as well as the Library becoming more a part of the local Connected Learning Ecosystem. We are currently planning our first partnership program together; a February vacation week camp to facilitate student projects for the MWV Youth STEM Expo.

Duraclean steam cleaned and vacuumed all of the carpets on the main floor of the Library. There were a few areas of heavy wear, such as behind the Circulation Desk, that were recommended for replacement.

Jeff joined the Project Succeed Advisory Board to help with strategic planning and goal setting for the program.

Bob received a letter from a historian and author who he had helped with research regarding Samuel A. Bemis in 2018. Materials provided by Bob have since been included in the author's book about colonial watchmakers. An article he wrote for the NAWCC (National Association of Watch & Clock Collectors) Watch & Clock Bulletin using the Bemis papers will also be expanded into a longer booklet.
