
Director Report April 10th, 2024



The four current Northern New Hampshire Library Co-op member libraries voted unanimously on April 9th to add Ossipee Public Library to the cooperative. Adding a fifth library will further expand the collection of materials available to Conway's residents. Last year 9,636 items were transferred between the NNHLC member libraries.

Kate Baldwin and Kathy Keene returned to the Library with huge smiles and a warm welcome from all of our staff and patrons. Both were eager to pick back up where they left off and have brought a whole new energy as we return to fully staffed again.

Annie coordinated with Portland Paper Products to install new paper towel dispensers in the building as part of a project to increase the efficiency of how certain supplies are purchased.


