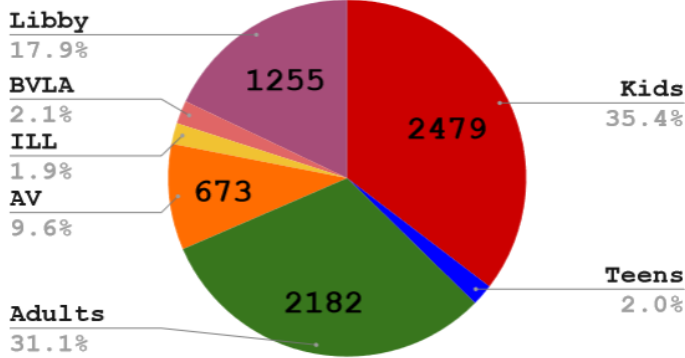


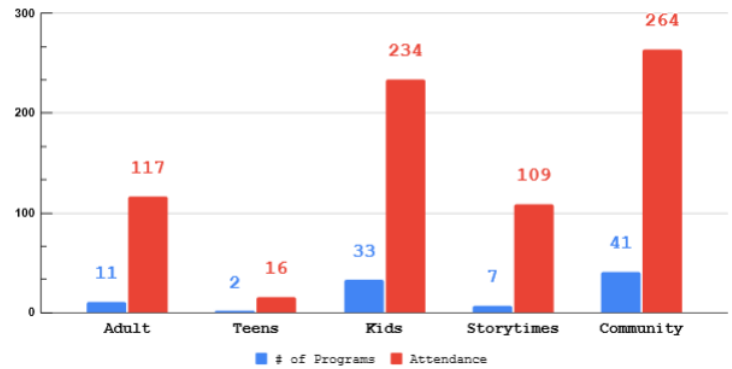

Annie led an ILS training for the Ossipee library staff as part of their integration into the Northern NH Library Co-operative.



Knowles Industrial will be on site June 13th to complete the cleaning mock-up and 3D scanning of the existing column.

Jeff will be attending the New Directors' Workshop at the NH State Library on June 14th.

Through a USDA distance telemedicine grant and in partnership with the UNH Center for Digital Health, the Library will be receiving REAL virtual reality platform equipment designed to provide telerehabilitative services. A training for library staff and local clinical providers is scheduled for July 10th.



The Library Volunteer Appreciation Picnic has been moved to Friday, August 9th to accommodate more staff attending.

EOC Environmental was hired to complete a mold inspection and assess the air quality of the staff area in the library basement. The growth present was deemed safe to be removed by library staff wearing proper PPE. Any records that required retaining were wiped with a vinegar dilution and are now stored in a separate container. The Town provided a dump truck to be loaded with trash, and excavated around the northwest foundation of the building to install improved drainage. Duraclean provided a deep cleaning of the area once everything had been removed. The walls were covered with multiple coats of mold killing paint before receiving a beautiful purple top coat. All of the air filters in the building were replaced and All Temp recommended a dehumidification pump to reduce the relative humidity of the space, which will be installed soon.
